Pupil Premium Funding 2013/14

What is the Pupil Premium?

The Pupil Premium is additional funding from the government that is given to schools to help disadvantaged children and young people do well at school. This extra money is allocated to schools for children from Reception to Year 6 who have registered for Free School Meals (FSM) throughout their time at school, are Looked After or have parents in the armed forces.

In 2013.14 the funding allocated was £900 per child and £300 for the children of Armed Forces families.

The Government's guidance allows schools to decide how to use their funding, as they feel that schools are in the best position to decide what additional provision should be made for individuals or groups of pupils.

Impact

We know that Pupil Premium funding is having an impact at Hollydale because our end of year assessments for pupils in 2014 demonstrate that in Years 1, 2, 3 and 5 children eligible for PPG outperformed the non PPG peers and in Years 2 and 6 the pupils

eligible for PPG achieved in line with National Expectations. This demonstrates that PPG is closing the gap between the achievement of advantage and disadvantaged children as intended.

Key stage 1 in 2014

Reading – 82% of disadvantaged pupils attained Level 2 or above, while 85% of other pupils attained Level 2 or above.

Writing – 75% of disadvantaged pupils attained Level 2 or above, while 85% of other pupils attained Level 2 or above.

Mathematics – 89% of disadvantaged pupils attained Level 2 or above, while 92% of other pupils attained Level 2 or above.

Key stage 2 in 2014

Reading – 81% of disadvantaged pupils attained Level 4 or above, while 85% of other pupils attained Level 4 or above. **Writing** – 86% of disadvantaged pupils attained Level 4 or above, while 77% of other pupils attained Level 4 or above. **Mathematics** – 86% of disadvantaged pupils attained Level 4 or above, while 85% of other pupils attained Level 4 or above.

Key stage 1 in July 2015

Reading – 81% of disadvantaged pupils attained Level 2B or above, while 67% of other pupils attained Level 2 or above.

Writing – 81% of disadvantaged pupils attained Level 2B or above, while 67% of other pupils attained Level 2 or above.

Mathematics – 78% of disadvantaged pupils attained Level 2B or above, also 78% of other pupils attained Level 2 or above.

Key stage 2 in July 2015

Reading – 96% of disadvantaged pupils attained Level 4 or above, while 86% of other pupils attained Level 4 or above.

Writing – 81% of disadvantaged pupils attained Level 4 or above, while 79% of other pupils attained Level 4 or above.

Mathematics – 92% of disadvantaged pupils attained Level 4 or above, while 86% of other pupils attained Level 4 or above.

GPS - 85% of disadvantaged pupils attained Level 4 or above, while 79% of other pupils attained Level 4 or above.

RWM - 81% of disadvantaged pupils attained Level 4 or above, while 79% of other pupils attained Level 4 or above.
