

Curriculum- Maths

1 hour daily

Solve a wider range of problems, using written and mental methods of calculation. Measures, classification of shapes and properties.



Curriculum - Maths Times Tables and Maths Fluency



We will have regular short sessions to focus on maths fluency e.g. number bonds, division fact, multiplication facts; mental arithmetic skills and rapid recall.

Curriculum-Science

2 hours per week



This term, LKS2 will be studying Animals including Humans looking at the purpose of different muscles and bones. We will also be looking at the right amounts and types of food.

We will undertake a variety of investigations.

PE sessions are taken by a Specialist coachonomous Our PE days in LKS2 are Wednesday(Birch)/Friday (Cedar & Chestnut).

All children are expected to fully participate in PE lessons.

PE KIT

P.E. Our PE topic this term will be Games (Birch) and Chance to Dance (Cedar and Chestnut)

Chance to Dance is a brilliant opportunity for the children to learn ballet with the Royal Ballet Company. They will attend a 'taster' session next Friday and then weekly lessons will commence after that.

In Music LKS2 will start Ukulele this week, taught by a specialist teacher. The children will be given the opportunity to perform in class and whole school assemblies.

Chestnut and Cedar will be taught chess by a specialist teacher each Friday. This is a wonderful way to apply problem solving and communications skills learned elsewhere in the currciculum, whilst also having fun and gaining a life long skill! Birch will begin their lesson later in the term.



Topic: This term, the theme for our topic work will be 'They Made a Different' where children will focus on significant people in history such as Ernest Shackleton and Oloudah Equiano. This will also tie into our Black History Month celebrations.

History: Children will learn to find historical information from a variety of sources.

Tasks set by us will provide a valuable opportunity for your child/children to consolidate the learning taking place in school that week.

Homework

Show interest and give support, it will encourage your child to develop positive attitudes to learning in and out of school.

It's a good idea if your child has a break and something to eat before starting on homework. Ask your child to explain the homework task and how it follows on from what they were studying at school.

Help your child to become an independent learner. Explain how to look up information or find a word in a dictionary rather than simply giving an answer.
