Welcome to Summer 2! This half term the children will be focusing their learning on their topic 'Seasides'. This will develop their geographical skills.

Summer 2 2018 - This half term KS1 (Y1 & Y2) will be learning about the following topics:

Phonics Screening Check	<p>The statutory phonics screening check will take place during the week commencing 11th June. The purpose of the Year 1 phonics check is to confirm whether individual pupils have learnt phonic decoding to an appropriate standard. The check will take the form of a ten page booklet with four words on each page. The check will contain 40 words. Half the words will be real words and the other half will be non-words (pseudo/alien words). Each pseudo word will be accompanied by a picture of an alien. Pupils who can read non-words should have the skills to decode any unfamiliar word. Non-words are included to make sure the check assesses phonic decoding as intended. You will be informed of whether or not your child has met the required standard when you receive your child's report in July. If your child does not meet the required standard, appropriate support will be put in place and will continue into Year 2 when they will have the chance to re-take the test. English	<p>This term, we will be reading <i>Jim and the Beanstalk</i>. This will be linked to our phonics and spelling. We will be inferring thoughts and feelings of the characters and writing letters and diaries in role. We will compare this story to the original <i>Jack and the Beanstalk</i> story and identify similarities. Some of our Literacy work will be linked to our Topic and R.E. this term, particularly the story of Diwali in R.E.</p>
Reading Records	<p>The children will bring home a banded book and a book from the book corner twice a week. Please read and discuss the book with your child. Parents must record in the reading records every time they read at home. Please note that children are required to have their book bag with their reading record inside every day. The reading books for Elm and Oak will be changed every Monday and Friday.</p>
Phonics	<p>Phonics will be taught every day and this will be consolidated in Literacy and weekly spellings. Spellings will be sent home every Friday and tested the following week. We will focus on the Year 1/2 spelling rules and patterns.</p>
Maths	<p>Children will continue to consolidate their knowledge of number and place value. They will continue to count to and across 100, forwards and backwards, beginning with 0 or 1, or from any given number. Children will use their knowledge of place value to solve problems involving missing numbers, as well as to compare and order numbers to 100 and beyond. They will practise counting in 2s, 5s and 10s, using what they know to recognise and complete number patterns and sequences. They will also continue to consolidate their knowledge of the four operations (addition, subtraction, multiplication and division) and practise solving problems involving time, shape and money. Please continue to encourage your child to learn their 2, 5 and 10 times tables. Year 2 should also be learning their 3 and 4 times tables.</p>
Science	<p>This term, our topic will be Living Things and their Habitats. Children will learn to explore and compare the differences between things that are living, dead, and things that have never been alive. They will learn to identify that most living things live in habitats to which they are suited and describe how different habitats provide for the basic needs of different kinds of animals and plants, and how they depend on each other.</p>

	They will use close observation of plants and animals in the school garden to understand simple food chains.
Computing	The children will be studying coding using the Scratch Junior app with Mr Latimer.
Topic	This half term our topic will be The Seaside. We will be learning to name the physical and human features of a seaside locality and finding some different seaside localities around the UK. We will also be finding out about seaside holidays in the past and how they compare to holidays now. This topic will prepare us for our end-of-year visit to Joss Bay.
R.E.	Our R.E. focus this term will be Hinduism. We will learn about some of the key beliefs and practises of Hindus. After this, we will move onto retelling the story of Rama and Sita and describing how Diwali is celebrated by Hindus.
Art / Design & Technology	Children will be making their own Diva lamps linked to our RE topic. There will be a whole-school Arts Week beginning 9 th July. We will find out about a famous artist and reproduce some work in their style during this week.
P.E.	Elm and Oak will continue to have PE on a Thursday with the coaches. Please ensure that your child/children have the following kit for PE: Black tracksuit bottoms or shorts, a white t-shirt or top and black trainers or plimsolls. Our focus this term will be ball skills.
Music	KS1 will continue to have recorder lessons every Tuesday. Children are encouraged to bring their own recorder.
P.S.H.E. & Citizenship	Our focus this half term will be 'Changing Me'.
Homework	Children will be set Literacy, Maths and Phonics homework based on their learning throughout the week. Children should continue to learn their times tables, number bonds and number facts (doubles and halves) , which will be tested on a regular basis. Children can practice using Timestable Rockstars, for which they have their own login. Additional maths homework will be assigned on the Mathletics website, for which each child also has their own username and password. Children should also learn spellings which will be sent home every week and tested the following week.
