Spring 1 2019 - This half term Year 3 will be learning about the following topics:

English	We will begin the term by reading 'The Day I swapped my Dad for two Goldfish' by Neil Gaiman. We will read and discuss the story, identifying the different characters and voices by using dramatised reading. We will identify the features and conventions of written dialogue and use of speech marks, demonstrate and then write dialogue. We will use a playscript to identify and highlight features and then write and perform a play script where a piece of the text is converted. We will then go on to create an entirely new scene for a pilot for a TV show. Using the 'First Drawing by Mordicai Gerstein' we will write diary entries, explore the conventions of speech, create character descriptions and finish by writing our own historical narratives. Grammar will be focusing on adverbial clauses. Spelling lists will be sent home on Mondays and tested the following week. We will continue to focus on the Year 3/4 spelling rules and patterns such as prefixes and suffixes.
Reading Records	The children will bring home a book from the class book corner or the school library every night. Please read and discuss the book with your child. Children must record in the reading records every time they read at home. Please note that children are required to have their book bag with their reading record inside every day.
Maths	In Numeracy pupils will consolidate our knowledge of efficient mental and written methods of multiplication and division. We will then move onto subtraction and addition of money and the representation of different coins. Towards the end of

	<p>term we will begin thinking about data and how it can be collected and displayed, interpreting bar charts and pictograms. Maths week will focus on the subject of shapes.</p> <p>Please ensure that your child knows number bonds to one hundred and all times tables and related division facts (2, 3, 4, 5, 8 and 10) —it is vital that children know these in order to progress in numeracy.</p>
Science	<p>Our topic this half term is States of Matter. We will undertake a range of investigations to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • compare and group materials together, according to whether their properties • observe how some materials change state when they are heated or cooled, • measure or research the temperature at which materials change state in degrees Celsius (°C) • identify the part played by evaporation and condensation in the water cycle
Computing	<p>Computing this half term will focus on being able to use sequence, selection and repetition in programs. There will also be a continuation of using technology safely, respectfully and responsibly.</p>
History/ Geography	<p>This term we will study our Active Planet. This is a history topic in which we will be learning to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • To describe and understand what is under the Earth’s surface. • To describe and understand how volcanoes are formed and how they affect people’s lives. • To describe and understand what causes earthquakes and how they are measured. • Describe and understand what causes tsunamis and how they affect people.
Art & Design	<p>We will be creating prints and pastel drawings inspired by Japanese artist Katsushika Hokusai.</p>
P.E.	<p>The focus in PE this term will be hockey. Cedar will have PE on a Wednesday morning. Please ensure that your child/children have the following kit for PE: Black tracksuit bottoms, a white t-shirt and black trainers or plimsolls.</p>
Music	<p>LKS2 will have ukulele lessons from a specialist teacher. We will be performing as part of ukulele festival at the Royal Festival Hall on Tuesday 5th February.</p>
R.E.	<p>Throughout the year we will be investigating the question: How are symbols and sayings important in religion? This term we will be considering how art is used to express important beliefs in two religions – Christianity and Islam.</p>
Modern Languages	<p>Spanish will be taught by our specialist teacher.</p>
P.S.H.E. & Citizenship	<p>Our focus this half term will be ‘Dreams and Goals.’ We will be exploring what we want to achieve, where we are now and how we can set ourselves challenges to support one another.</p>
Homework	<p>Each Friday your child will be set literacy and numeracy tasks. These must be returned the following Tuesday. Children should continue to learn their times tables, which will be tested on a regular basis. Children can practice using Timestable Rockstars, for which they have their own login. Additional maths</p>

	<p>homework will be assigned on the Mathletics website, for which each child also has their own username and password. Children should also learn spellings which will be sent home every week and tested the following week. First News passwords have also been issued so children can practice their comprehension at home.</p>
